

HAUSMANN AT REST

MADISON BREWER BURIED IN CALVARY CEMETERY

High Mass Sung at Holy Redeemer Church—Procession From Church Notably Long Service at Tomb.

Joseph Hausmann was laid to rest in Calvary cemetery today. The remains were taken from the old home at 9 o'clock this morning to the church of the Holy Redeemer, where high mass was celebrated by Rev. Alois Zitterl, pastor. The church was thronged, and the streets, from the home to the church, were lined by people of all classes—from Governor La Follette to the humblest citizen. There was an immense throng. The business pulse in that portion of the city stopped for a time.

The Turner society rallied every member and appeared in the procession in a body, as did the Maennerchor society. A great number of members of the Mozart Lodge of Odd Fellows were in line, but not as a body, the decedent not having affiliated with the order in late years.

OUT OF TOWN FRIENDS.

Scores of relatives and friends from outside were present, among them Mrs. D. Blass, John Blass and wife, and others of the same families, relatives of the decedent's first wife. They
